2. Scope of International Relations

Countries therefore have set rules, regulations or guidelines that each country must adhere to. As a rule or regulation may appear in the form of a written agreement. Which have different names, such as treaties, conventions, contracts, charters, agreements, etc., or may be an understanding that each party adheres to without appearing in writing, which is called customary international cultural law.

2. Scope of International Relations

Written rules or customs are called all international law with the objective of the state or other international actors have behaved according to the rules for mutual understanding and for order in the world society which covers various aspects of relations, including political aspects such as alliance treaties Treaty of Amity, Charter of the United Nations, Economic aspects such as International Fund Treaty, Trade agreements and social tariffs such as human rights educational and cultural exchanges, technology, such as an agreement on research in space, etc.
